## 7s [JOIN] & [JUNCT] & [JUG] & [JUS] (join, to join)

ADJOINS	ADIJNOS	ADJOIN, to lie next to [v]
ADJOINT	ADIJNOT	type of mathematical matrix [n -S]
ADJUNCT	ACDJNTU	something attached in subordinate position [n -S]
ADJUSTS	ADJSSTU	ADJUST, to bring to more satisfactory state [v]
COJOINS	CIJNOOS	COJOIN, to join together [v]
CONJOIN	CIJNNOO	to join together [v -ED, -ING, -S]
DISJOIN	DIIJNOS	to separate (to set or keep apart) [v -ED, -ING, -S]
ENJOINS	EIJNNOS	ENJOIN, to command (to direct with authority) [v]
JOINER	DEIJNOR	joining of parties in lawsuit [n -S]
JOINERS	EIJNORS	JOINER, carpenter [n]
JOINERY	EIJNORY	trade of joiner [n -RIES]
JOINING	GIIJNNO	juncture (act of joining) [n -S] / JOIN, to unite (to bring together so as to form whole) [v]
JOINTED	DEIJNOT	JOINT, to fit together by means of junction [v]
JOINTER	EIJNORT	one that joints (to fit together by means of junction) [n -S]
JOINTLY	IJLNOTY	together (into union or relationship) [adv]
MISJOIN	IIJMNOS	to join improperly [v -ED, -ING, -S]
REJOINS	EIJNORS	REJOIN, to join again [v]
SUBJOIN	BIJNOSU	to add at end [v -ED, -ING, -S]
UNJOINT	IJNNOTU	to separate at juncture [v -ED, -ING, -S]

## 8s [JOIN] & [JUNCT] & [JUG] & [JUS] (join, to join)

ADJOINED	ADDEIJNO	ADJOIN, to lie next to [v]
ADJUSTED	ADDEJSTU	ADJUST, to bring to more satisfactory state [v]
ADJUSTER	ADEJRSTU	one that adjusts (to bring to more satisfactory state) [n -S]
ADJUSTOR	ADJORSTU	adjuster (one that adjusts (to bring to more satisfactory state)) [n -S]
BIJUGATE	ABEGIJTU	two-paired [adj]
BIJUGOUS	BGIJOSUU	bijugate (two-paired) [adj]
COJOINED	CDEIJNOO	COJOIN, to join together [v]
CONJOINT	CIJNNOOT	CONJOIN, to join together [adj]
CONJUGAL	ACGJLNOU	pertaining to marriage (legal union of two persons of opposite or same sex) [adj]
CONJUNCT	CCJNNOTU	one that is joined with another [n -S]
DISJOINT	DIIJNOST	to put out of order [v -ED, -ING, -S]
DISJUNCT	CDIJNSTU	alternative in logical disjunction [n -S]
ENJOINED	DEEIJNNO	ENJOIN, to command (to direct with authority) [v]
ENJOINER	EEIJNNOR	one that enjoins (to command (to direct with authority)) [n -S]
JOINABLE	ABEIJLNO	JOIN, to unite (to bring together so as to form whole) [adj]
JOINTING	GIIJNNOT	JOINT, to fit together by means of junction [v]
JOINTURE	EIJNORTU	to set aside property as inheritance [v -ED, -S, -RING]
JUNCTION	CIJNNOTU	place where things join [n -S]
JUNCTURE	CEJNRTUU	act of joining (to unite (to bring together so as to form whole)) [n -S]
READJUST	ADEJRSTU	to adjust again [v -ED, -TING, -S]
REJOINED	DEEIJNOR	REJOIN, to join again [v]
UNJOINED	DEIJNNOU	not joined (to unite (to bring together so as to form whole)) [adj]



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
