SENATES	AEENSST	SENATE, assembly having high deliberative and legislative functions [n]
SENATOR	AENORST	member of senate [n -S]
SENECIO	CEEINOS	flowering plant [n -S]
SENESCE	CEEENSS	to grow old [v -D, -S, -CING]
SENHORA	AEHNORS	married Portuguese or Brazilian woman [n -S]
SENHORS	EHNORSS	SENHOR, Portuguese or Brazilian gentleman [n]
SENILES	EEILNSS	SENILE, one who exhibits senility (mental and physical infirmity due to old age) [n]
SENIORS	EINORSS	SENIOR, person who is older than another [n]
SENIORAS	AENORSS	SENIORA, married Spanish woman [n]
SENORES	EENORSS	SENIOR, Spanish gentleman [n]
SENSEIS	EEINSSS	SENSEI, teacher of Japanese martial arts [n]
SIGNIOR	GIINORS	signor (Italian title of courtesy for man) [n -I, -S]
SIGNORA	AGINORS	Italian title of courtesy for married woman [n -S, -RE]
SIGNORE	EGINORS	signor (Italian title of courtesy for man) [n -RI]
SIGNORS	GINORSS	SIGNOR, Italian title of courtesy for man [n]
SIGNORY	GINORSY	seignory (power of seignior) [n -RIES]

SENHORES	EEHNORSS	SENHOR, Portuguese or Brazilian gentleman [n]
SENILELY	EEILLNSY	in senile manner [adv]
SENILITY	EIILNSTY	mental and physical infirmity due to old age [n -TIES]
SENIORITA	AEINORST	unmarried Spanish girl or woman [n -S]
SIGNIORY	GIINORSY	signory (seignory (power of seignior)) [n -RIES]
