PROVIDER	DEIOPRRV	one that provides (to supply (to furnish with what is needed)) [n -S]
REVISING	EGIINRSV	REVISE, to make new or improved version of [v]

REVISORY	EIORRSVY	pertaining to revision (revised version) [adj]
TELEWISE	EEEILSTV	to broadcast by television (electronic system of transmitting images and sound) [v -D, -S, -SING]
VIDEOCAM	ACDEIMOV	camera for recording images and usually sound [n -S]
VIDEOING	DEGIINOV	VIDEO, to record visual images on magnetic tape or disc [v]
VIDEOTEX	DEEIOTVX	electronic system for transmitting data to subscriber's video screen [n -ES]
VISIONAL	AIILNOSV	imaginary [adj]
VISIONED	DEIINOSV	VISION, to imagine (to form mental picture of) [v]
VISITANT	AIINSTTV	visitor (one that visits (to go or come to see someone or something)) [n -S]
VISITING	GIIINSTV	act or instance of visiting someone or something [n -S] / VISIT, to go or come to see someone or something [v]
