SHIITAKE	AEHIIKST	dark Oriental mushroom [n -S]
TRAPEZII	AEIIPRTZ	triangular muscles of back [n TRAPEZII]
ZOMBIISM	BIIMMOSZ	system of beliefs connected with West African snake god [n -S]
