CONIINE	CEIINNO	poisonous alkaloid [n -S]
OBIISMS	BIIMOSS	OBIISM, obeahism (use of obeah) [n]
SKIINGS	GIIKNSS	SKIING, sport of traveling on skis [n]
TAXIING	AGIINTX	TAXI, to travel in taxicab [v]

Ends with -II

BACCHII	ABCCHII	BACCHIUS, type of metrical foot [n]
DENARII	ADEIINR	DENARIUS, coin of ancient Rome [n]
NAUPLII	AIILNPU	NAUPLIUS, form of certain crustaceans [n]
SENARII	AEIINRS	SENARIUS, Greek or Latin verse consisting of six metrical feet [n]
SPLENII	EIILNPS	SPLENIUS, a muscle of neck [n]
