MIDRIFF	DFFIIMR	middle part of body [n -S]
MIDSHIP	DHIIMPS	pertaining to middle of ship [adj]
MIDSIZE	DEIIMSZ	of intermediate size [adj]
MIDSOLE	DEILMOS	middle layer of sole of shoe [n -S]
MIDTERM	DEIMMRT	examination given in middle of academic semester [n -S]
MIDTOWN	DIMNOTW	central part of city [n -S]
MIDWAYS	ADIMSWY	MIDWAY, avenue at fair or carnival for concessions and amusements [n]
MIDWEEK	DDEIKMW	middle of week [n -S]
MIDYEAR	ADEIMRY	middle of year [n -S]

MIDBRAIN	ABDIIMNR	middle region of brain [n -S]
MIDLING	DDGIILMN	cut of pork [n -S] / MIDDLE, to place in middle (area or point equidistant from extremes or limits) [v]
MIDFIELD	DDEFIILM	middle portion of playing field [n -S]
MIDLIFER	DEFIILMR	middle-aged person [n -S]
MIDMONTH	DHIMMNOT	middle of month [n -S]
MIDNIGHT	DGHIIMNT	middle of night [n -S]
MIDPOINT	DIIMNOPT	point at middle [n -S]
MIDRANGE	ADEGIMNR	middle of range [n -S]
MIDSHORE	DEHIMORS	designating fishery that is between inshore and offshore fisheries [adj]
MIDSIZED	DDEIIMSZ	midsize (of intermediate size) [adj]
MIDSPACE	ACDEIMPS	middle of space [n -S]
MIDSTORY	DIMORSTY	middle of story [n -RIES]
MIDWATCH	ACDHIMTW	watch on ship between midnight and 4 A.M. [n -ES]
MIDWATER	ADEIMRTW	middle portion vertically of body of water [n -S]
