YAWLING	AGILNWy	YAWL, to yowl (to utter loud, long, mournful cry) [v]
YAWNERS	AENRSWY	YAWNER, one that yawns (to open mouth wide with deep inhalation of air) [n]
YAWNING	AGINNWy	YAWN, to open mouth wide with deep inhalation of air [v]
YAWPERS	AEPRSWY	YAWPER, one that yawps (to utter loud, harsh cry) [n]
YAWPING	AGINPWY	loud, harsh cry [n -S] / YAWP, to utter loud, harsh cry [v]
YEALING	AEGILNY	person of same age [n -S]
YEAREND	ADEENRY	end of year [n -S]
YEARNED	ADEENRY	YEARN, to have strong or deep desire [v]
YEARNER	AEENRRY	one that yearns (to have strong or deep desire) [n -S]
YEASTED	ADEESTY	YEAST, to foam (to form foam (light, bubbly, gas and liquid mass)) [v]
YEELINS	EEILNSY	YEELIN, yealing (person of same age) [n]
YELLERS	EELLRSY	YELLER, one that yells (to cry out loudly) [n]
YELLING	EGILLNY	act or instance of making loud cry [n -S] / YELL, to cry out loudly [v]
YELLOWY	ELLOWYY	somewhat yellow [adj]
YELPERS	EELPRSY	YELPER, one that yelps (to utter sharp, shrill cry) [n]
YELPING	EGILNPY	YELP, to utter sharp, shrill cry [v]
YENNING	EGINNNY	YEN, to yearn (to have strong or deep desire) [v]

YOBBIISH	BBHIOSY	characteristic of yob [adj]
YOLKIER	EIKLORY	YOLKY, resembling yolk (yellow portion of egg) [adj]
YOMPING	GIMNOPY	YOMP, to march with heavy equipment over difficult terrain [v]
YONDERS	DENORSY	YONDER, far distance [n]
YONKERS	EKNORSY	YONKER, younker (young gentleman) [n]
YOUNGER	EGNORUY	inferior in age [n -S] / YOUNG, being in early period of life or growth [adj]
YOUNKER	EKNORUY	young gentleman [n -S]
YOUTHEN	EHNOTUY	to make youthful (young (being in early period of life or growth)) [v -ED, -ING, -S]
YOWLERS	ELORSWY	YOWLER, one that yowls (to utter loud, long, mournful cry) [n]
YOWLING	GILNOWY	YOWL, to utter loud, long, mournful cry [v]
YUCKIER	CEIKRUY	YUCKY, disgusting [adj]
YUKATAS	AAKSTUY	YUKATA, light cotton kimono [n]
YUKKIER	EIKKRUY	YUKKY, yucky (disgusting) [adj]
