OUTTURN NORTTUU quantity produced [n -S]  
TURNOUT NORTTUU assemblage of people [n -S]

OUTWALK AKLOTUW to surpass in walking [v -ED, -ING, -S]  
WALKOUT AKLOTUW strike by workers [n -S]
