| SHVITZES | EHISSTVZ | SHVITZ, to sweat (to perspire (to give off moisture through pores of skin)) [v] |
| SITZMARK | AIKMRSTZ | mark left in snow by skier who has fallen backward [n -S] |
| SJAMBOKS | ABJKMOSS | SJAMBOK, to strike with whip used in South Africa [v] |
| SKYWATCH | ACHKSTWY | to observe sky for heavenly bodies or aircraft [v -ED, -ING, -ES] |
| SLAPJACK | AACJKLPS | pancake [n -S] |
| SMOKEBOX | BEKMOOSX | chamber for producing and containing smoke [n ES] |
| SNUFFBOX | BFFNOSUX | box for holding snuff [n -ES] |
| SPHYNXES | EHNPSXSY | SPHYNX, cat of breed of hairless cats [n] |
| SQUOOSHY | HOOQSSUY | squashy (soft and moist) [adj -HIER, -HIEST] |
| VANQUISH | AHINQSUV | to defeat in battle [v -ED, -ING, -ES] |
| VOWELIZE | EEILOVWZ | to provide with symbols used to indicate vowels [v -D, -ZING, -S] |
| WAXBERRY | ABERRWXY | berry with waxy coating [n -RRIES] |
| WAXWORMS | AMORSWWX | WAXWORM, moth that infests beehives [n] |
| WHEEZERS | EEEHRSWZ | WHEEZER, one that wheezes (to breathe with whistling sound) [n] |
| WHEEZIER | EEHIRWZ | WHEEZY, characterized by wheezing [adj] |
| XYLOTOMY | LMOOTXYY | preparation of sections of wood for microscopic examination [n -MIES] |
| YAHRTZEIT | AEHIRTYZ | anniversary of death of family member observed by Jews [n -S] |
| ZOMBIISM | BIIMMOSZ | system of beliefs connected with West African snake god [n -S] |
| ZYGOMATA | AAGMOTYZ | ZYGOMA, cheekbone [n] |
